Radio Etiquette - Mount Marathon Race Sweep Teams

All Race officials will be on channel (2) the whole time.

If anyone needs first aid help call **Ski Patrol/Emergency** on channel (2).

The Ski Patrol/ Emergency will only switch to channel 8 once they are with a patient and need to relay medical information.

<u>SWEEPERS</u> - switch to channel (6) for extended conversations to stay off the main channel.

<u>Do's</u>

- 1. Be brief and to the point. When the race is on, stay off the radio unless absolutely necessary.
- 2. Listen before you begin your transmission, and always wait a second before you speak after keying the push to talk button.
- 3. Speak directly and clearly with an even tone into the microphone at a distance of (1) inch.

Don'ts

- 1. Talk too much. Only speak when absolutely necessary. Safety information must take priority.
- 2. Swear. This is an open radio channel.
- 3. Shout into the radio.
- 4. When you are finish with your transmission don't forget to release the talk switch

Radio Terminology

• <u>Affirmative</u> - Yes

<u>Acknowledge</u> - Confirm you understand my message

• **Confirm** - My version is ... Is that correct?

Control - Radio call name for Race Director/Communications, Lori Drapper

Correction - I made a mistake, correct version is.....

<u>Do you read</u> - Made more than one attempt to reach, please acknowledge.

Go Ahead - Listening, proceed with your message.

• Negative - No

Stand By - Busy, please pause for a moment.
