- ★ Race Distance: 18,211 feet or 269 feet short of 3½ miles
- ★ Oldest Winner: Ed Vogel, 40 years old, won in 1925 with a time of 57:40
- ★ Youngest Winner: Ephrim Kalmakoff, age 14, won in 1928, time of 52:35
- ★ Longest Record Held: 30 years, 1928 to 1957, by Ephrim Kalmakoff
- ★ Closest Race: Sven Johansson beat Don Stickman in 1954 by 1 second
- ★ Most Consecutive Wins: Six, Sven Johansson, 1954 to 1959
- ★ Most Wins: Seven: Bill Spencer, 1974-1976, 1981-1983 and tie 1986
- ★ Most Alaskan Communities Represented: 22 in 1981
- ★ Most Official Number of Participants: 213 since 1979
- ★ Highest Number of Finishers Under 60 minutes: 38 in 1982
